Day 3**Exploring Sapa's Hill Tribe Communities**

After breakfast, your local guide will meet you around 9:30 AM to begin a captivating trekking adventure. The trek leads you to the villages of Y Linh Ho and Lao Chai, both nestled near the scenic Muong Hoa River. Y Linh Ho is home to the Black Hmong ethnic group, offering a chance to observe their daily routines and cultural practices amidst stunning natural surroundings.

As you continue your trek, you'll reach Lao Chai, another Black Hmong village, where you can further immerse yourself in the local way of life. This part of the journey provides excellent photo opportunities and insights into the traditional customs of these communities. The trek also includes a path to Ta Van village, situated at an altitude of 1,200 meters. This village is inhabited by the Zay people, a minority group primarily residing in Vietnam's mountainous Northwest regions.

During your time in Ta Van, you'll have the opportunity to interact with the Zay people, learning about their unique culture and traditions. The surrounding scenery of mountains and terraced rice fields offers a truly picturesque backdrop. After a day of exploration and cultural exchange, a car will transport you back to Sapa town. The evening is then free for you to relax at your leisure in your Sapa hotel.

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Day 4

Cat Cat Village Exploration and Hanoi Transfer

Following your visit to Sin Chai, a jeep will transfer you 3 kilometers back to Sapa town. Between 3:00 PM and 3:30 PM, you will board a shuttle bus for your return journey to Hanoi. This transfer allows you to relax and reflect on your experiences in the northern mountains as you head back to the capital.

The scenic drive through lush landscapes includes a brief rest stop. By 10:30 AM, you will arrive at Hoa Lu Ancient Citadel, a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site recognized for its historical importance as Vietnam's former capital and its connections to three successive Vietnamese dynasties. Your visit includes the Dinh King Temple, an impressive 17th-century structure featuring intricate wood and stone carvings. A delicious lunch of local cuisine awaits you at a nearby restaurant.

At 2:00 PM, embark on a traditional sampan boat trip, rowed by locals, along the Ngo Dong River. This serene journey offers breathtaking views of picturesque rice paddy fields and leads you through the enormous Hang Ca, Hang Hai, and Hang Ba caves, where striking stalactites in various formations can be admired. Day 16

Phnom Penh Royal History and Tragic Past

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch | Stay: Hotel in Phnom Penh

Your guide will pick you up from your hotel to commence a full-day exploration of Phnom Penh. The first destination is the Royal Palace, a magnificent complex built by King Norodom in 1866. Within its grounds, you will also visit the splendid Silver Pagoda, named for its floor composed of 5,000 gleaming silver tiles. Inside, discover national treasures, including a 90-kilogram solid gold Buddha adorned with diamonds and a rare 17th-century emerald and baccarat crystal Buddha. This site offers a profound glimpse into Cambodia's royal and religious heritage.

Continue to the National Museum, designed in 1917 by French archaeologist and painter Georges Groslier in a classic Khmer architectural style. The museum houses an exceptional collection of Khmer art, particularly ancient sculptures spanning various historical periods, providing a rich overview of the country's artistic legacy. The afternoon takes a more somber turn with a visit to the Tuol Sleng Genocide Museum (S-21), a former high school that became a notorious prison under the Khmer Rouge regime, followed by the Killing Fields of Choeung Ek, located approximately 15 kilometers from the city. These sites offer powerful insights into Cambodia's tragic modern history and serve as a memorial to those who suffered.

Afterward, head to the bustling Russian Market (Psah Tuol Tom Pong), where you can browse an array of goods including antiques, silver and gold jewelry, gemstones, silk, kramas, wood and stone carvings, clothing, CDs, and unique souvenirs. This vibrant market provides an opportunity to experience local commerce and find memorable keepsakes. At the end of the tour, you will be driven back to your hotel to rest and reflect on the day's profound experiences.

Day 17

Battambang Transfer and Sunset Bat Spectacle

Meals: Breakfast | Stay: Hotel in Battambang

At 8:00 AM, your guide and driver will pick you up for a private overland transfer to Battambang Province, a journey of approximately 291 kilometers that takes around 5 hours. Along the way, you will make a stop to explore the abandoned royal city of Udong, which served as Cambodia's former capital in the early 17th century. From the hilltop, enjoy sweeping views of

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the surrounding countryside and the ancient stupas scattered across the ridge, offering a sense of historical grandeur. The journey continues towards Kampong Chhnang, where you will visit a traditional pottery village. Here, you can observe the various stages of pottery-making, a craft deeply embedded in local culture. You will also have the opportunity to learn about the traditional rice wine-making process, a unique experience that reveals another aspect of rural Cambodian life and craftsmanship. Afterward, proceed to Battambang, a charming provincial town known for its peaceful atmosphere and well-preserved French colonial architecture. Upon arrival, you will check into your hotel. In the late afternoon, your tour takes you to Phnom Sampov, a hilltop site featuring temples, shrines, and the poignant Killing Caves, a significant reminder of Cambodia's past. As dusk approaches, typically between 5:30 PM and 5:50 PM, you will witness the incredible spectacle of millions of bats streaming out of a cave, forming an endless ribbon across the sky. This natural phenomenon is a truly memorable sight. Afterward, you will return to your hotel for the night in Battambang.

After climbing more than 350 steps, you will be rewarded with a serene setting and sweeping panoramic views of the surrounding countryside. This temple, built under King Udayadityavarman II, remains one of Battambang's best-preserved ancient sites.

Conclude your day with a ride on the unique Bamboo Train, a fun and distinctly Battambang experience. This light wooden platform glides along old railway tracks, offering a playful journey and an excellent opportunity to admire the rural landscape, which is particularly beautiful at sunset. This rustic adventure provides a charming glimpse into Cambodian village life. You will then return to your hotel for the evening.

Next, visit a local village along the Sangke River, where you will stop at a small countryside workshop that produces rice paper, a fundamental ingredient in many Cambodian dishes. This stop offers a fascinating glimpse into daily rural life and traditional craftsmanship, allowing you to see the process firsthand. Your final visit in Battambang is the Temple of Ek Phnom, an 11th-century Angkorian ruin built under King Suryavarman I. The temple features a series of prasats on a raised platform, with carvings that are still in relatively good condition. Right beside these ancient ruins stands Wat Ek Phnom, a modern pagoda that creates a striking contrast between old and new.

In the afternoon, depart Battambang for your journey to Siem Reap. The drive covers approximately 170 kilometers and takes about 3 to 4 hours. Upon arrival, you will be transferred directly to your hotel for check-in. The evening is then free for you to relax and prepare for your exploration of the magnificent Angkor temples.

The intertwining of nature and ancient stone creates a truly unique and photogenic setting. Continue to Angkor Wat, the most famous and best-preserved temple in the Angkor region. Covering an immense 81 hectares,
